

#### **Writing Quotations**

A **direct quotation** is the exact words of a speaker. When you write a direct quotation, enclose the speaker's words in quotation marks (""). Do not put quotation marks around words that identify the speaker.



The angry customer demanded, "Give me my money back."

An **indirect quotation** repeats a speaker's message but does not use the speaker's exact words. Do not enclose indirect quotations in quotation marks.

**Indirect:** The clerk advised her to go to Customer Service.

**Direct:** The clerk advised her, "Go to Customer Service."

Add quotation marks wherever they are needed in each sentence. If the sentence is an indirect quotation, write IQ on the line.

• If the phrase that identifies the speaker comes before the quotation, place a comma after the phrase and before the quotation marks.

Lee asked, "What will we have for dinner?"

• If the quotation is a statement, and it comes before the phrase that identifies the speaker, use a comma instead of a period as its end mark.

"I'm going to the grocery store now," said Elena.

• Enclose both parts of a divided quotation in quotation marks. Do not capitalize the second part unless it begins a new sentence.

"Wait just a minute," said Lee, "and I'll join you."

"That would be nice," replied Elena. "We can walk there."
